





# The 2024 NZSFC Youth Nationals:

# A Record-Breaking Event

The 2024 NZSFC Youth Nationals supported by Daiwa ended with a record-breaking turnout and an impressive display of angling skill and sportsmanship. This year, 341 anglers participated, marking a significant 57% increase from the previous year. The competition was fierce, representing 15 clubs battling it out for top honours.

Throughout the competition, a total of 799 fish were caught, including those weighed, measured, tagged, and released. This number is a testament to the skill of the keen young anglers participating in the event. Tag and release efforts were also commendable, highlighting the conservation-minded approach of the next generation of kiwi anglers.

Several clubs stood out for their strong participation and performance in the competition. The Mercury Bay Game Fishing Club had a significant showing, with 122 anglers representing the club. Counties Sport Fishing Club also made a mark with 47 anglers, showcasing the club's commitment to youth fishing development. Tairua Pauanui Sport Fishing Club and Kawhia Boating and Angling Club also had impressive showings, with 35 and 30 entries respectively.

### Highlights from 2 weeks of School Holiday Fishing



As the 2024 NZSFC Youth Nationals kicked off, the excitement among those entered was palpable. With no school for 2 weeks and the promise of fishing instead; this year's event looked likely to be one for the books. Week One began with a mix of weather conditions, offering both challenges and opportunities for the participants.

The first part of week 1 saw some remarkable performances, with anglers like Brock Johnston from Counties Sport Fishing Club and Indi La Franchie from Kawhia Boating and Angling Club standing out in their respective categories. Brock's dominance in Kahawai, Shark, and Snapper categories early on showcased his skill and determination, while Indi's impressive performance in Kahawai highlighted her talent at a young age.

As the competition progressed, the anglers faced changing conditions and shifting leaderboards. The improved weather conditions in the second part of the week brought about significant changes, with leaders in some sections facing stiff competition from others. Clubs like Kawhia Boating and Angling Club and Whakatane Sport Fishing Club made their presence felt, with multiple anglers securing top positions in various categories.

Week Two revealed the changing dynamics of the leaderboard. Kawhia Boating and Angling Club emerged as a dominant force, with strong performances in Albacore, Gurnard, and Kahawai categories. Other clubs like Mercury Bay Game Fishing Club and Whakatane Sport Fishing Club also made their mark, with anglers such as Jaxon Walker, Alexis Ogle and Sam Jackson putting up impressive displays.

#### Jaxon Walker's Historic Striped Marlin



11-year-old Jaxon Walker made history by landing an estimated 85kg Tag and Release (T&R) Striped Marlin. This catch not only marked a first for junior anglers in both the MBGFC Junior Tournament and the NZSFC Youth Nationals but also showcased Jaxon's perseverance after previous setbacks. His determination is a true inspiration to all young Kiwi anglers.

#### Ali Sanders' Rare Yellowfin Tuna



Ali Sanders, fishing aboard Early Bird for the Kawhia Boating and Angling Club, achieved a rare feat by reeling in a 48kg Yellowfin Tuna. This catch was not only a personal triumph but also a significant moment for Kawhia, marking the first Yellowfin Tuna caught in the history of the Youth Nationals. Ali's success is celebrated by Kawhia and the NZSFC.

#### Lachlan Kidd's Swordfish Feat



Fishing for the Mount Maunganui Sport Fishing Club, **Lachlan Kidd** landed a solid 219kg Swordfish aboard the Bandit skippered by Kane Spiers. This catch, a first for the Youth Nationals, showcased Lachlan's skill and determination, adding to the event's rich history.

#### Riley Gibson's Broadbill Triumph

Riley Gibson's catch of a 184kg Broadbill was a remarkable achievement, despite challenges with broken scales at the Whangarei Deep Sea Anglers Club. The support and camaraderie shown by Marsden Cove with a courtesy weigh of his fish demonstrated the strong bonds within the NZSFC's fishing community. Riley's dedication and skill at such a young age are truly remarkable.
