YOUTH COMMITTEE UPDATE

We have a group of young anglers who form our Junior committee (which sits under the guidance of our Youth Steering Committee. We are looking for more keen young anglers from around the Country to get involved. Please contact Helen Pastor if you know of any likely candidates from your club.

We have established the Youth Ocean Trust and have been given the name *Nga tai tamariki ki te moana* from Joe Davis of Ngati Hei. The Trust will be launched this year, and will assist in funding of Youth activities.

MUSHY SNAPPER - WHAT'S THE STORY?

Recently in the media there has been much discussion about 'mushy snapper flesh' - many people have asked - what's the story? In short:

- Since last year fishers around the North Island have been catching snapper, kahawai, and trevally with mushy, milky-coloured flesh. Last December the NZSFC sent an Official Information Act request to Fisheries New Zealand (FNZ) asking for information.
- The 'mushy snapper flesh' has been described by a recent NIWA study as being due to 'muscular dystrophy' a breakdown of muscles due to chronic starvation. NIWA have said the fish are safe to eat. FNZ's reports identify a range of factors with 'chronic malnutrition' as the most probable cause, which means starvation over a long period of time. FNZ says the fish is safe to eat. - This condition is distinct from 'spent' fish with white flesh the difference is the meat being firm versus 'mushy and soft'
- Seen in approximately 20% of fish tending to be smaller fish.

FAR NORTH CRAYFISH (CRA1) JUDICIAL OUTCOME - WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

In November 2022, the outcome of a Judicial Review initiated by Environmental Law Initiative (ELI) regarding the Ministers decision when setting of the total allowable catch (TAC) for Northland Crayfish in CRA1 (East Coast Northland) was published.

- The Judicial Review found that the TAC setting in 2021 and 2022 was unlawful and the Government was forced to remake the decision ASAP.
- The Minister was directed to review CRA 1 management this year. NZSFC invested significant funds and worked with our partner organisations to <u>submit a comprehensive</u> response supporting the Court judgement
- The East Coast of Northland has significant 'kina barrens' this phenomenon was at the centre of the argument (where predators such as snapper and Crayfish are removed from an area, and Kina numbers explode when they don't have a natural predator and in turn eat the kelp forests) essentially the Court agreed that the consideration of the ecosystem had not been taken into account.
- A key argument was that the health and abundance of the ecosystem must be considered as a whole when considering the possible tonnage when harvesting a given species - in this case Crayfish. This is a notable precedent acknowledged by the Courts.

From 15 April 2023 the recreational daily bag limit for spiny rock lobster was reduced from 6 to 3, within a combined bag of 6 for spiny and packhorse crays. Read more <u>here</u>.
