Fisheries (Umupuia Beach Temporary Closure) Notice 2024 (Notice No. MPI 1854)

Pursuant to section 186A of the Fisheries Act 1996, the Minister for Oceans and Fisheries, after complying with the requirements of that section, gives the following notice.

Notice

1. Title

This notice is the Fisheries (Umupuia Beach Temporary Closure) Notice 2024.

2. Commencement

This notice comes into force on 7 August 2024.

3. Revocation of this notice

This notice is revoked on the close of 6 August 2026.

4. Umupuia Beach closed in respect of cockles for 2 years

- (1) A person must not take cockles from Umupuia Beach while this notice is in force.
- (2) In this clause, -

cockle -

a. means the shellfish of the species Chione (Austrovenus) stutchburyi

Umupuia Beach means all those New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line -

- b. commencing at a point on the mean high-water mark at Te Puea at the western end of the beach known as Umupuia Beach (at 36°53.774′S and 175°03.805′E); then
- c. proceeding in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to a point on the mean high-water mark at Whakakaiwhara Point (at 36°54.010′S and 175°05.910′E); then
- d. proceeding along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement.

5. Revocation

This notice revokes and replaces the Fisheries (Umupuia Beach Temporary Closure) Notice 2022 (Notice No. MPI 1550) (*New Zealand Gazette*, 30 November 2022, Notice No. 2022-sl5241).
