		The extended closure will recognise the

		protection is needed to continue the
		rebuild the pāua stock before a
		sustainable harvest can be considered

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anywhere within the rohe moana of Waimārama. There is still concern that even though there has been a four-year closure on the gathering of pāua a further two year's is needed to give the stock more time to rejuvenate and repopulate. The four two years for us as Māori and within the community is that this is the tau/rest period for all things within te ao Māori to settle and now the real work can start. The request for an extension is for tangata whenua, community purposes and the tiakitanga of their local taonga, pāua. The area is still inundated with holiday makers every year and this is increasing, especially during the summer period. The tangata whenua believe that the extended closure will assist the replenishing of the paua stock. The belief is that it will make a positive impact on the wellbeing and state of the paua and us the tangata whenua and community therefore ensuring that there will be paua stock there for our tamariki and mokopuna.

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## Supplementary Information

In order for the Minister for Oceans and Fisheries to impose a temporary fishing closure or method restriction/prohibition, they must be satisfied that it would recognise and make provision for the use and management practices of tangata whenua in the exercise of non-commercial fishing rights by


- Improving the size or availability (or both) of the requested species in the closure area; or
- Recognising a customary fishing practice in the area

If the request includes a proposed fishing method restriction/prohibition, in addition to the above criteria, the Minister must also be satisfied that the fishing method is having an adverse effect on the use and management practices of tangata whenua in the exercise of their non-commercial customary fishing rights.
